

PE and Sports Grant

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Hillside Primary School has decided to use the money to:

- Raise the profile of PE in school
- Improve weakness in Gymnastics throughout school
- Improve participation and success levels in ENSSP competition
- Ensure all children are able to swim minimum distance by end of year 6
- Improve staff confidence in teaching PE
- Increase participation in after school clubs
- Provide transport for SRB PE opportunities
- Increase participation in after school sport by ‘Non-sporty types’ and FSM + Ever 6 children
- Support for those requiring financial aid to participate in sport or activity

Review of spending

The majority of money spent was used to improve Gymnastics throughout the school. Our INSET was successful with teachers more capable and confident delivering Gym in school. After school club attendance increased and we took part in our first inter school gymnastics competition. The new gymnastics equipment has captured the children’s interest and they are excited about using the new vault, springboard and crash mats. This will continue to be a focus into 2014/15.

The impact of PE throughout the school has increased dramatically with increased numbers of children wanting to participate in school competition and after school sporting activities. Our competition results have been excellent this year, with county finalists in cross country, swimming and athletics, and we are looking to build on this success next year. Sports day competition was highly anticipated and enjoyed with the introduction of new medals and our school world cup was a huge success, the highlight being the trophy presentation on the final day!

Our decision to employ an additional swimming teacher benefitted those who were struggling to meet the 25m award. 7 of the 13 who were not on target achieved the award with the remaining 6 all making significant progress and being able to swim at least 10m from a starting point of 0m.

We have taken part in cricket, netball, football, athletics, cross country and swimming competitions this year in key stage 1 and key stage 2 as a result of the opportunities the funding has provided. This is our widest coverage of competition yet.

The provision of a basketball coach to give free coaching sessions to children on FSM or E6 provided all FSM children except 3 (who opted out) to participate in activity and coaching. The remaining places were offered out and filled to other children. One child was in receipt of funding to support after school athletics where, without the purchase of running spikes, they wouldn’t have been able to take part in this club with professional coaching.

A large proportion of the funding was used to provide transport for the SRB to participate in horse riding. This activity allows children who have learning and physical impairments to take part in activity which not only builds their strength, coordination and agility but also their confidence and motor skills. Without this funding they would have been unable to participate in this. Three of the children completing this activity were also in receipt of Free School Meals.
