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Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Working on <a href="#">Times Table Rockstars</a> - your child will have an individual login to access this (<b>20 mins on SOUND CHECK</b>). If your child works on '<a href="#">Numbots</a>' in school they can access this with the same login.</li> <li>Play on <a href="#">Hit the Button</a> - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.</li> <li>Practise telling the time. This could be done through this <a href="#">game</a> (scroll down to access the game). Read to the quarter hour and the nearest 5 minutes.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read.
